Miss Lillie Brown, Nurse Deaconess, daughter of G. W. Brown of Athens, is now employed and paid by the Dominion Government, and with a staff of workers composed of five women and two men, is located 300 miles north of Winnipeg and three miles from Hudson Bay Port, on an Indian Reserve.

Among those under their care is a school of fifty-six Indian children from five to 18 years of age.

The only employment for settlers in fishing and hunting. The weather is very cold.

The place is reached by boat in summer, but in winter they have no way out. When the ice is good, they get the mail every two weeks by dog train. There are only 29 white people in the place and 15 of these are children.

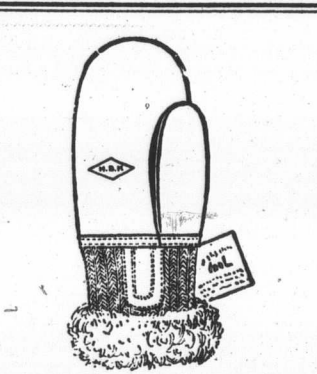

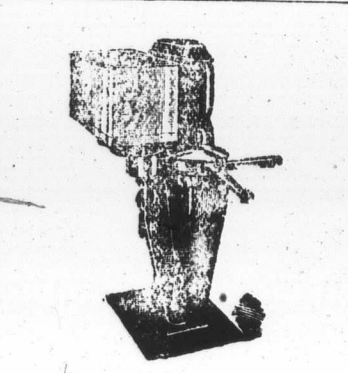
