



In the afternoon at 3.30 o'clock he received a civic address of welcome at the city hall, and had an opportunity of viewing the Parliament buildings and the experimental farm.

A state dinner was given in his honor last evening, followed by a reception, at which a large number of Ottawans were presented to his imperial highness.

This morning Prince Fushimi leaves for Brockville and the Thousand Islands, en route to Toronto.

JAPS COMPLAIN OF OUTRAGES.

Call Upon Government to Protect Rights and Property. Tokio, June 11.—The council of the

Rights and Property.

Tokio, June 11.—The council of the Progressives at a meeting yesterday adopted a resolution, the substance of which was as follows:

"The anti-Japanese feeling upon the Pacific coast of the United States, especially in San Francisco, culminated in an assault upon Japanese trading places last month, constituting a most flagrant violation of the rights guaranteed by the treaty concluded upon an equal footing between the two nations.

"The anti-Japanese acts are not of a temporary nature, and the federal Government at Washington must be held responsible for its failure to prevent such outrages.

"The attitude of our Government towards that in Washington has so far been unsatisfactory to the nation, and it is necessary that proper steps should be taken by our Government in order to maintain the national dignity and permanently ensure the safety of the rights and property of our compatriots in America."

BARGE CORNWALL AGROUND.

Sinks After Strenuous Efforts to Keep Her Afloat.

Brockville, June 11.—Coming down the Canadian channel early yesterday morning in a heavy fog, the barge Cornwall, laden with 1,200 tons of soft coal, ran aground at the head of Isle Royal, a short distance above Brockville.

The Cornwall, together with the Augustus, Princess and Arcadia, the last two grain-laden, were in tow of the tug Emmerson, and although the tug grated her keel all escaped the rocks but the Cornwall. An examination showed the barge to be in a bad way, and she filled so rapidly that the pumps were of little avail. However, she was kept float until the afternoon, when all effort was abandoned, the boat finally becoming submerged in about 15 feet of water amidships. Her bow and stern are not so deep, and it is feared she has parfally broken in. Her present position would indicate this.
