## THREE TRAINMEN UP.

Face Charge of Manslaughter Result of Railway Wreck.

Parry Sound, Ont., June 11.—Conductor F. Graham, brakemen Locker and Lightbulb, and Fireman H. Gendreau appeared yesterday before Magistrate J. H. Knifton here yesterday on a charge of manslaughter, the result of a collision between two Grand Trunk trains on the morning of May 31, near here, in which brakeman Alexander Rochon was killed. Gendreau was acquitted, and the others were committed for trial, all being released on bail afterwards.

Engineer Champness did not turn up, and is believed to be in the United States.

The first witness was Dr. O'Gorman of Depot Harbor, who testified to the awful injuries suffered by Rochon.

Allan Kilpatrick, assistant trainmaster, testified as to the rules of the road and the assignment of train crews and their duty.

Trainman Kerr of the eastbound train, on which Rochon was killed, was in the engine at the time, and was partially injured. He said the collision occurred at 4.50 a. m., and the night was clear and the moon shining. The westbound train was ordered to sidetrack at Beauty's siding and waited for the eastbound. In some mysterious manner the westbound train passed the siding, although it is easy as well as switch lights, and there is a lumber yard and a small mill and settlement at the point, as well as a large water tank.

## FUSHIMI AT CAPITAL.

Again Receives Heartly Welcome From Canadians.

Ottawa, June 11.—Prince Fushimi arrived in Ottawa at 1 o'clock yesterday, and was received at the Central Station by a large number of citizens and by a guard of honor drawn from the Governor-General's Foot Guards. The station, the city hall, and many private buildings were hung with flags in honor of the distinguished visitor.

As the prince stepped from the train he was greeted with the strains of the Japanese National Anthem. His Excellency Earl Grey met his guest on the station platform, and after an inspection of the guard of honor the party drove off to Government House.

During his stay in the capital the prince is the guest of His Excellency Earl Grey at Government House. Immediately after his arrival he was entertained to luncheon at Government House. In the afternoon at 3.30 o'clock he received a cordial address of welcome at the city hall, and had an opportunity of viewing the Parliament buildings and the experimental farm.

A state dinner was given in his honor last evening, followed by a reception, at which a large number of Ottawans were presented to his imperial highness.

This morning Prince Fushimi leaves for Brockville and the Thousand Islands, en route to Toronto.

## JAPS COMPLAIN OF OUTRAGES.

Call Upon Government to Protect Rights and Property.

Tokio, June 11.—The council of the Progressives at a meeting yesterday adopted a resolution, the substance of which was as follows:

"The anti-Japanese feeling upon the Pacific coast of the United States, especially in San Francisco, culminated in an assault upon a Japanese trading place last month, constituting a most flagrant violation of the rights guaranteed by the treaty concluded upon an equal footing between the two nations.

"The anti-Japanese acts are not of a temporary nature, and the federal Government at Washington must be held responsible for its failure to prevent such outrages.

"The attitude of our Government towards that in Washington has so far been unsatisfactory to the nation, and it is necessary that proper steps should be taken by our Government in order to maintain the national dignity and permanently ensure the safety of the rights and property of our compatriots in America."

## BARGE CORNWALL AGROUND.

Sinks After Strenuous Efforts to Keep Her Afloat.


Brockville, June 11.—Coming down the Canadian channel early yesterday morning in a heavy fog, the barge Cornwall, laden with 1,200 tons of soft coal, ran aground at the head of Isle Royal, a short distance above Brockville.

The Cornwall, together with the Augustus, Princess and Arcadia, the last two grain-laden, were in tow of the tug Emmerson, and although the rocks grated her keel all escaped the rocks, but the Cornwall. An examination showed the barge to be in a bad way, and she filled so rapidly that the pumps were of little avail. However, she was kept afloat until the afternoon, when all effort was abandoned, the boat finally becoming submerged in about 15 feet of water amidst ships. Her bow and stern are not so deep, and it is feared she has partially broken in. Her present position would indicate this.
