THE JOHN PALMER COMPANY.

Alterations and Extensions to be Made in Company's Factories.

A New Tanning Co. to be Formed With \$100,000 Capital.

Increasing Demand for Palmer's Goods—An Important Industry.

The business of The John Palmer Company, Ltd., manufacturers of oil tanned footwear and patent and carriage leathers, is extending so rapidly that the firm finds extensive alterations in its plant and large additions to its buildings an immediate necessity. The Palmer industry is now one of the most important in the city and citizens will be glad to know that the projected extension of the business means the employment of a greater number of men. The Palmer Co's. goods are now in demand from the Atlantic to the Pacific, from Sydney to Dawson, and as was noted in this paper a day or two ago a trial shipment of larrigans and moccasins is this week being made to South Africa, where it is said there is a large market for that class of goods.

To Enlarge Their Manufactory.

The Palmer Company finds its Westmorland street premises, where the oil tanned leathers are manufactured, too small. More room is demanded both for tanning and manufacturing. It has therefore been decided to remove all the tanning to the Queen street establishment, and utilize all the Westmorland street premises for manufacturing alone. By this change the firm will be able to increase its output of larrigans, moccasins and sporting boots by nearly one half more than the present capacity of the factory.

Changes at Queen Street Tannery.

The removal of the oil tanning plant to the Queen street tannery will mean extensive changes in that establishment, where, heretofore, only patent, upholstery and carriage leathers have been manufactured. All of the oil tanned leathers used by the Palmer Company will in future be manufactured at the Queen street premises.

It may be here mentioned that the Palmer Co. attributes its success in a large measure to the uniform superior quality of its leather, and this unrivalling high quality is maintained because the head and manager of the concern, Mr. John Palmer, is a practical and expert tanner and personally superintends every detail of that part of the business, the manufacturing part being under the superintendence of Mr. Chas. K. Palmer.

Another Big Tannery Projected.

The taking of the Queen street leather works to manufacture oil tanned leathers will mean that other premises will need to be secured for tan and manufacture the patent and upholstery leathers, which is by no means an unimportant part of the company's business. It is in contemplation to organize a large tanning and leather manufacturing company, with a capital stock of about \$100,000. In fact, negotiations for the formation of such a company are already well advanced. While it is understood that the Messrs. Palmer will own a controlling interest in the new company, yet it is known that considerable outside capital will be put into the enterprise. The tannery will manufacture all kinds and grades of leather, including patent and oiled, for which there is an increasing demand for footwear.

It has not been decided where the new tannery will be located, but it will be either within or adjacent to Fredericton. The flat near the shoe factory is talked of, but difficulties present themselves there in disposing of the waste water and refuse.

The Palmer Co. at present gives constant employment to about 150 hands, chiefly men earning large wages. When the contemplated enlargement of the business is consummated employment will be furnished for many additional hands.

CARAQUET WHARF.

A \$60,000 Contract Awarded by Federal Government to Simmons and Burpee.

Simmons & Burpee, of Gibson, have been awarded by the Dominion government the contract for building the Caraque wharf. The contract price is in the vicinity of \$60,000. Mr. S. D. Simmons leaves this evening for St. John upon business in connection with the contract.

REFUSES TO EAT.

A Quebec Murderer Under Sentence of Death.

Refuses to Partake of Food in Any Shape.

Declared He Would Never Hang—Last Meal on Thursday.

OTTAWA, Feb. 21—Stanislas Lacroix, the murderer awaiting execution at Hull gaol, still continues to refuse food. His last meal was taken Thursday. Fasting, combined with mental strain, threatens to produce a breakdown. He does not sleep, but merely gets short dozes, which never exceeds half an hour in length. He is under sentence to be hanged on March 21. When sentence was passed, Lacroix said: "You will never hang me."
