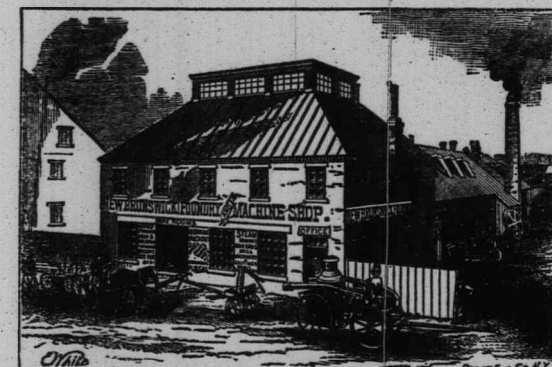

JAMES S. NEILL.

Diocesan Church Society.

The society met again at 7 o'clock on

Tuesday evening of last week.

The report on subscriptions showed an

increase of \$1,470.20 over those of last

year.

The report of the Treasurer showed that

the debit balance of \$1,889.28 had been

reduced to \$93.86. The whole amount

received by the missionaries was

\$15,631. The amounts apportioned to

Bathurst and Cambridge were not paid

as the places had not complied with

the conditions of the grant. The pensions

paid amounted to \$976 and salaries to

\$400; contingencies \$436.41. The pay-

ment on account of the Douglas property

was \$1,828. The receipts were: Sub-

scriptions and collections \$6,260.71;

children's mission boxes \$847.93; Hazen's

trust \$1,012.20; interest \$3,000.97. The

report on Sunday Schools showed an in-

crease in subscription box money, \$2,589

being collected in two years.

Rev. Mr. Wiggins moved that the re-

port contain the names of those collect-

ing by boxes or the number on the boxes.

After some discussion the motion was

carried.

The report of the Home Mission com-

mittee was then read and adopted.

On motion of Mr. G. A. Schofield, se-

conded by Canon Ketchum, one clerical

or lay representative, selected by each

denary, to be resident in the same and

to have his name certified by the secre-

tary of such denary as duly elected at a

regular meeting, was added to the Board

of Home Missions, and the constitution of

the board was altered for that purpose.

The report of the globe committee,

stating that it had sold land in the Parish

of Sumner, Gloucester County, to Ed-

ward Robison for \$250, was read and

adopted.

The Board of Home Missions was then

closed.

and G. M. Armstrong, Geo. A. Schofield,

T. W. Davis, G. S. Grimmer, W. L. Jarvis,

weather.

The Society met again at 10 o'clock. After
