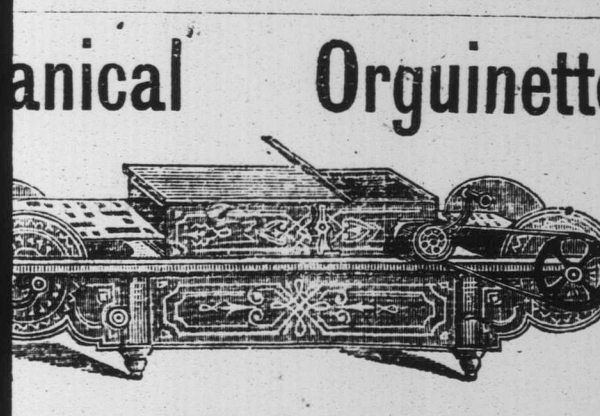

### RAILWAYS IN THE NORTH- WEST.

ROADS UNDER CONSTRUCTION,  
AND COMPANIES ORGANIZING  
—WITHIN THREE OR  
FOUR YEARS THE  
COUNTRY WILL  
BE WELL SUP-  
PLIED WITH  
RAILWAY  
COMMUNICATION.

Through the enterprise of the  
Pacific Railway Company, and  
the ease with which roads can  
be constructed in a prairie coun-  
ty, it is evident that within the  
next three or four years the  
North-West will be well sup-  
plied with railway communi-  
cation, while its magnificent water  
routes will also be made use of,  
and an immense extent of  
country will be opened up for  
settlement. To the south there  
is the existing road to the bound-  
ary of Pembina; to the south-  
east a road will be built by  
the "Winnipeg South-Eastern  
Railway Company," under a  
charter granted last year by  
the Manitoba Legislature, which  
will open up the district to the  
east of the Red River, and will  
ultimately connect with an Amer-  
ican road, making an air line  
from Winnipeg to Deluth. This  
company has already been or-  
ganized, the following gentle-  
men composing the first direc-  
torate:—Peter McLaren, Arthur  
F. Eden, Duncan McArthur,  
John Shields, Edward P. Lea-  
cock, J. Gillespie, John J. Mc-  
Donald, Wm. H. Lyon, John G.  
Haggart, R. J. Whittle, Hon.  
John Sutherland, and Samuel  
L. Bedson. To the east there  
will be the main line of the Ca-  
nada Pacific through Rat Por-  
tage to Thunder Bay, and thence  
to Ottawa and Montreal. Nearly  
3,000 men are now working  
on this section, and it is ex-  
pected that trains will be run-  
ning from Winnipeg to Thun-  
der Bay next year. To the North-  
West communication will be  
opened between Lake Winnipeg  
and Hudson's Bay by the Nelson  
River railway, which is now be-  
ing surveyed, and it is said to  
be of construction, and much  
shorter than is generally imag-  
ined. This road would, for a  
time, depend on the water com-  
munication of Lake Winnipeg  
and the Saskatchewan; but it  
will ultimately be extended to  
Winnipeg, where it will be a  
formidable competitor for the  
grain traffic of the North-West.  
To the west of Winnipeg, in  
addition to the main line of the  
Pacific there will be no less than  
six branch lines, including the  
South-Western. Three of these  
will be to the south of the main  
line and three to the north. The  
Manitoba and South-Western  
will run in a south westerly  
direction from Winnipeg, and  
then westerly to the foot of the  
Rocky mountains. This road is

### THE LAND BILL.

The Irish Land Bill has re-

Captain Hooper, of the Arctic  
steamer "Corwin," writes from  
St. Michaels, July 7th. He  
learned from natives definitely  
that nothing has been heard of  
anyone belonging to the "Jean-  
ette" on the Siberian coast. Na-  
tives of Cape Serdze saw the  
"Jeanette" on her way north. A  
party of walrus hunters boarded  
her. They described her as a  
three-masted steamer, with lots  
of coal dogs and sleds on deck,  
and says she had two Esqui-  
maux from the American side on  
board. After passing Cape  
Serdze she steamed away to  
northward.

A despatch from Cairo says a  
serious affray recently occurred at  
Soudan in consequence of the  
preaching of a false prophet, and  
one hundred and fifty Egyptian  
soldiers were killed.
