

The Rev. gentleman has just arrived from England, and is to take up his residence at Random Sound.

According to our Northern contemporary diphtheria is at present at Bar'd Islands. There have been forty-three cases in the last few weeks out of which ten deaths have taken place and several lying in a precarious state.

We understand since the going off of the caplin not much has been done in Trinity Bay with the hook and line. A few of the last boats that left Trinity, have returned with full loads and report the other Trinity craft well fished. Agricultural prospects also appears very favorable in that locality.

We understand that from 20 to 25 craft arrived at Twillingate, with from 500 to 700 qtls. fish.

The Labrador Mail arrived here last night about twelve o'clock. The news by this mail is not as favorable as anticipated, herring being scarce in many places and no fish catching on any part of the shore worth reporting. At Domino they have already seined a large quantity, and are yet doing very fair. We are indebted to the Hon. John Rorke, for the above information.

The Snow Bird, Kinsella master, arrived here last Saturday, after a three weeks search for bait. The Captain reports bait scarce in every quarter. This vessel landed for the season, about 700 qtls. dry cod fish, the crew shared about £20 per man. She will now proceed to Labrador to take cargo for Hon. John Rorke.

His Lordship Bishop Jones, arrived at Hearts Content about 1 o'clock yesterday, and will consecrate the new church in course of erection there.

His Lordship consecrated the new church and cemetery at Trinity Thursday morning last and held confirmation on Sunday last in St. Paul's church, Trinity.

We would call the attention of the police to a nuisance which is just becoming a general practice of a number of boys ranging from six to twelve years old, who monopolised the middle of the street for the purpose of whipping tops, between the hours of nine and eleven when they should be studying their lessons or have their master or mistress make a top of them. Shortly before 8 o'clock last night Her Majesty's ship *Northampton*, bearing the flag of Vice-Admiral Sir Leopold McClintock, Knight, F.R.S., arrived at the port from Quebec via Pictou. The *Northampton* is the largest modern battleship which ever visited this side of the Atlantic, and is one of the finest in the British Navy, being lighted with patent electric lights, white bells and telephones communicate with all parts of the ship and her compasses, steering gear and rigging are all of the most improved character. The vessel is of strange appearance, certainly not handsome, but imposing, being painted white, and the hull standing over twenty feet out of water. Her port holes are so arranged that guns can be fired ahead, astern or abeam. The Admiral's apartments are furnished with regal magnificence. The vessel is fitted with two engines of 6000 horse power, working twin screws, that give a maximum speed of fourteen knots. Her sail area is 24,165 square feet. She is armed with four eighteen ton guns, eight twelve-ton broadside guns, six twenty-pounders, three nine-pounders, two 6.3 inch guns, and six Nordenfelta's, being heavy armour plated and is divided into water-tight compartments, carries 600 men, and is commanded by Captain Fisher. Sir Leopold McClintock is a world-famed man as being prominent in several Arctic expeditions. In 1857, when Lady Franklin and friends, unable to obtain any further aid from the Government of the day in what it considered a fruitless search, determined at their own expense to fit out another expedition and make a final effort to obtain some tidings of the fate of the brave Sir John Franklin and his expedition, dispatched by the Government twelve years previously, he was chosen as the most suitable officer to command the expedition, sailing from Aberdeen, September 1st 1857, in the steam-yacht *Polaris*. His three years' absence resulted in a solution of the mystery so long surrounding the lost crews of the *Erebus* and *Terror*. For his service he was knighted, made an L.L.D. of Trinity College, Dublin, and of Cambridge, D.C.L. of Oxford, and was presented with the freedom of the City of London. He is a good specimen of the old-fashioned British seadog, but very affable withal.—Telegram.

The schooner *Annie Laurie*, belonging to Mr. J. Colbourne, arrived at Twillingate, from the French Shore on the 8th instant. She reports boats there taking about two quintals fish per day.—Ibid.

A Gloucester despatch of the 9th inst. says nineteen arrivals are reported from mackereling grounds to day with 5,000 barrel, the largest receipts for any day this season. Four are from the Banks of Newfoundland and nine from George's Banks, with 21,000 pounds of codfish and 114,000 pounds of halibut.—Ibid.

A serious accident occurred at Little Bay Mines on Thursday last. A man named John Appleton fell down one of the shafts, a distance of about one hundred and sixty feet, and was instantly killed.—Ibid.

The Supreme Court on Northern Circuit opened at Twillingate Monday, His Honor Judge Pinesent, presiding. His Lordship spoke very favorably on the peaceful condition of that town since the last sitting of the Court, and after disposing of the several cases the Court rose on Thursday.
