COMMISSIONER HIGGINS

HERE TO CONFER ON SAL-

VATION ARMY MATTERS

Com. W. J. Richards, head of the
Salvation Army in Eastern Canada
and Col. John McMillan, Chief Sec-
retary are conferring with Commis-
sioner Higgins, Chief of Staff and
Second in Command of the Salvation
Army for the work who arrived in
Boston from London, England, recent-
ly. Com. Higgins came to America
to discuss matters pertaining to Sal-
vation Army affairs in Canada and
the United States, with Commander
Eva Booth, head of the Salvation
Army in the United States and with
the Canadian officials. He was for-
mally named Chief Secretary of the
United States and recently succeeded
Com. Howard as Chief of Staff and
Second in Command. Many matter
having any important bearing upon
the future policy of the Salvation
Army, and its reconstruction work
are to be taken up at this meeting
and it is expected that on his return
Com. Richards will have something
to say in regard to the questions af-
fecting the policies to be followed in
Canada.

EUROPEAN SCHEME, NEARLY

"FREE LOVE," CONDEMNED

CHICAGO, March 25—"Man shot-
tag" plans in Europe, or rather the
plans to remedy the man shortage
due to ravages of war, do not meet
with enthusiastic support in Chicago
especially among the women. Their
especial ire is aroused by suggestions
made by Mrs. G. Gasquoin E. Hart-
ley, an English woman writer and
Mme. Odette Dulac, a French writer.
Mrs. Hartley offers the following so-
lution:—

Open recognition of honorable part-
nerships outside the marriage rela-
tions, not necessarily permanent, with
proper provision for the guarding of
women, who in all cases should be
protected.

Marriage has ceased to become a
discipline; it has become an experi-
ment.

Divorce relief from misfortune not
crime.

The door for marriage must be left
open to go out, as it is left open to
enter.

ENGLAND BARES PLOT

FOR IRISH REVOLT

LONDON, March 25—Details of an
alleged revolutionary plot by Sinn
Feiners, British Bolshevik sympath-
izers and Germans, with uprisings
set for April 5th, in Ireland, England
and Scotland, are today in possession
of the British government, according
to information which is both unofficial
and unconfirmed, but which was se-
cured from authentic sources.

The assassination of Thomas Mc-
Curtain, Sinn Fein lord mayor of
Cork, grew out of this revolutionary
conspiracy, it was declared.

Learn of Conspiracy.

"Technical officers" were to come

the British Government learned of the
plot and the Germans never arrived.

retly taken to crush the conspiracy
is, not revealed, but the ring leaders
are said to be known. Special
