**We are on the Eve of a Social Revolution!**  
I remember, in noting the signs of the times, and forecasting the future, that the outbreak of European war would not be of the nature of political but a social revolution. We fully believe it. In England, France, Germany, Spain, Portugal, Italy, and elsewhere, movements which indicate manifestly that hidden forces are at work beneath the surface, which at any moment burst forth and change society and charter its existing institutions as an earthquake shivers towns and cities into promiscuous ruins.  
In England and France, particularly, strikes and lockouts seem to be increasing in their magnitude, both as regards the number of persons engaged in them and the important interests involved. And the most recent and most common features of these struggles between "labor and capital" is that almost as soon as one of them is ended another begins. Newspapers compute and describe the cost of these strikes, the immense losses resulting from them both to employers and employees, particularly to employees, the misery and suffering they produce, and the folly of engaging in them. Yet all these precautions and exhibits have no effect in the way of preventing a recurrence of strikes than the crying of a child or the whistling of a school boy. As we have already said, scarcely has one case closed than another commences. And not only in the struggle of these contentions on the industrial, but also their violence and desperation. Constantly, too, they are becoming more and more far-reaching and complex in the interests they involve, and more socialized.  
This is true of European countries and still more true is it as regards our own country. Capitalists hire and employ bands of armed mercenaries (private armies) to protect themselves and their industries, establishments, and laborers organize military companies, arm themselves with Winchester rifles, and hurl dynamite cartridges. It is only a few months since strikes and consequent violence at Homestead, in Pennsylvania, and at three other places in as many other States required, for their suppression, the sending out of thousands of Militia. Yet now again, the morning newspapers contain telegrams from Homestead, giving accounts of a conflict between "union" laborers and "scabs," or non-union laborers, in which three persons were shot, and a dozen others seriously wounded by other missiles.  
This is not an isolated instance. It is multiplied by other instances constantly occurring, showing that the absence of organized conflicts between "labor and capital" does not betoken peace, but is only an armed truce, in which both parties are constantly preparing for a more determined and desperate conflict at no distant time.

These facts ought to lead employers and employees to search for a peaceful solution of the questions ever pending between them. But one of the worst features of the situation is that instead of striving to settle their relations and cultivating mutual regard for each other's interests, each party is becoming more and more determined to defend and protect its own rights (real or supposed) irrespective of the interests and rights of the other party.  
This is especially true of capitalism. It is the history of the teaching of an entirely false philosophy, they strenuously assert that they have a right to buy labor at the lowest possible price. In fact, they are not buying labor, but they are buying up the power and control of the market, and they are doing so by force and by fraud.
