On Tuesday Lord Crewe, leader of the Government in the Up-per House will introduce the amendng Bill and after Lansdowne's reply the debate will probably be adjourned. Speculation regarding the proposals for amending the Bill has been met to some extent by Lloyd George's declaration at Saturday's demonstration in South London. The Chancellor stated the proposal would be that every county in Ulster should have the option of voting itself out of the operation Home Rule Bill, until two general elections have passed. This differs but little from the offer made n March 9th, by Asquith of the exclusion of any county Ulster by vote for a period six years, since the average life of Parliament is now about four years.
