# What Horse-

The use of the "horse-power" as a measure of an engine's work came naturally from the fact that the first engines were built to do work which had formerly been performed by horses. John Smeaton, who built atmospheric engines before Bolton and Watt placed their more complete machine upon the market, had valued the work done by a strong horse as equal to lifting a weight of 22,000 pounds one foot high in a minute When Bolton and Watt began to bid for public favour, they agreed to place their engines for "the value of one-third part of the coals which are saved in its use." 


