He declared he had found widespread sentiment throughout the United States in favour of the League, and he sounded the warning that in many parts of the world, were symptoms developing that were profoundly disquieting. He surprised his audience by telling them there were more armed men in Europe than before the war. He affirmed that the tendency of most larger countries was toward greater military equipment. There seems to be a conviction during the last, few months that, force, violence and bloodshed again are coming into favor, as an instrument for settling International disputes," Lord Robert said.
