Mr. Cullen then turned his attention to his text, and for half an hour was

given the undivided attention of his given the undivided attention of his large audience. The theme was the Church of God, and the preacher divided it into the heads: "What is it?" "The Builder," and "The Process of Building." Each topic was discussed interestingly and in a well thought-out manner. "We may meet in our lodges and have pleasant gatherings," said Mr. and have pleasant gatherings," said Mr. Cullen in his concluding remarks. "I have frequently been there and enjoyed them very much. The true secrets of a master Mason are-shall I telli this audience? They would be amazed if I did. They would marvel. They are: First, to understand his work; second, his materials; third, his men; fourth, his trust, and fifth, his destiny, and how to work it out loyally and obediently. I am satisfied that no matter where you go, you find these principles running right through. They are principles which should be known and practiced as well. Then there is this about it: There is a deeper meaning underlying all grips, passwords and signs.
