STREET RAILWAY CO. APPEARS VERY ANGRY

Will Not Bother With Springbank Amusements, Says Mr. King.

The London street railway will not bother about amusement privileges at Springbank this season. The opposition of the water commissioners has caused the company to refuse to have anything more to do with the matter, according to the manager.
"We asked for the merry-go-round privilege merely to help Mr. Joyce out," said Manager King. "He could not get the right, so we tried to assist him. So far as we are concerned we do not care about the subject at all. We are not going to bother about the amusement privileges this year in any event. So far as we are concerned the incident is closed."
As a result it is not likely that there will be any "merry-go-round" at the park this summer.
It is also certain that no other amusements except the theatre will be put in commission.

THE MOTOR MEET

Three Days' Racing Opens at Indianapolis Speedway.
Indianapolis, May 27.—Three days of motor racing with a field of sixty starters, opened today at the Indianapolis speedway, the new 2½-mile course, the only brick track in the world. All possible safeguards have been taken to prevent the repetition of the fatal accidents that marred the races at the speedway last summer. A cement retaining wall has been built along the upper edge of the course near the stands to prevent cars crashing into the crowds of spectators, if wheels should break or tires rip. The track ground to the smoothness of the floor, offering no resistance to the speed of the drivers can from their motors.
A 100-mile race presented the greatest excitement of the day for today. Twelve cars were entered. The other events are for five and ten miles, including speed trials, and a free-for-all handicap with 26 cars entered.
