

## EIGHTH BRIGADE ALMOST READY TO PROCEED OVERSEAS

Training in Canada Is About Completed.

LT.-COL. WIGLE IS PROUD

Says Unit of Which He Is  
Brigadier Has Attained  
High Efficiency.

CAMP BORDEN, Sept. 5.—The 8th Brigade which includes the 15th, 16th, 18th Oxford, and the 14th Lambton battalions, is rapidly completing its training in Canada.

Today the 14th Battalion was inspected in musketry, and tomorrow the Oxford County unit will parade at 9 a.m. for inspection by Lieut.-Col. J. S. Campbell, attached to the general staff, in the same department of the service, Lieut.-Col. E. S. Wigle, brigadier, has been requested to attend the inspection also.

"This leaves the 16th Battalion yet to be inspected so that the actual training is really complete. The work from now on will be chiefly devoted to perfecting the work already taught."

Lieut.-Col. Wigle is enthusiastic about the way the brigade has progressed and stated tonight that he thought that the training of his three battalions had advanced to such a stage, and that such a high standard of efficiency had been obtained it would be only a short time before they got orders to proceed overseas.

The brigade and eleven other battalions will commence their monthly leave of four days on Thursday returning to camp on Tuesday. Special trains will carry the Western Ontario men to their homes, and some of them will no longer have to celebrate their long leave before departure for England.

"The majority of these battalions will not return to winter billets this year," stated an officer who is a member of a Western Ontario unit.

The following official message is given out in camp orders, as an expression of the governor-general's opinion of the camp after his inspection yesterday:

**Five Inspections Today.**

At 9:30 a.m. the 13th Norfolk Battalion, and at 2 p.m. the 14th Grey Battalion will occupy the rifle ranges for inspection in musketry, while at the same hour the 12th "London's Own" Battalion will be formed up to display its prowess in bayonet fighting and physical training. The scouts of the 11th Haldimand Rifles, and 16th Simcoes will be inspected at 9 a.m. by the district intelligence officer.

A special advanced course in musketry for brigade and battalion musketry officers will be held each Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, until further notice, at 2:30 p.m. commencing tomorrow.

**Go to British Columbia to Vote.**

Authorized by a circular letter from Ottawa, headquarters is asking today for officers commanding brigades and independent units to forward at once a list of all men serving in the ranks who are residents of British Columbia. It is understood that arrangements will be made whereby all soldiers entitled to exercise the franchise in that province will be able to vote in the coming election. At the present time there are 48 mechanical transport men attached to No. 2 C.A.S.C. training depot in camp who were drafted from British Columbia. Outside of this draft it is not thought that there are many others who might be affected by this order.

**Call for Physicians.**

Information was received by the A. D. M. S. today that medical practitioners were needed as officers to bring the C. A. M. C. units overseas up to the proper strength to care for their ever-increasing work. The practice of allowing qualified men to join the R. A. M. C. is to be discontinued until the medical practitioners duly qualified and who are available for military service should apply at once to the local C. A. M. C. unit for information.

## RETURNED SOLDIERS WILL HAVE CHANCE TO PROVE CHARGES

Square Deal for Secretary Ed Lance Is Requested.

MASS MEETING FRIDAY

Co-operation Urged in Order  
That Best Results May  
Be Obtained.

Things were lively at a meeting of the Returned Soldiers' Association last night. Nearly forty returned men of the city were present, including a deputation of the newly-formed Voluntary Aid Commission, composed of Sergt.-Major Husband, Quartermaster-Sergt. Bushby and Sergt. Murray. They came for the purpose, it was stated, of arranging for the co-operation of the Returned Soldiers' Commission and the Voluntary Aid Commission.

The members stated that they were not championing Secretary Ed Lance of the Sportsman's Patriotic Association, but they wished him to get a square deal. They were willing to help the returned soldiers to get their rights. Co-operation was absolutely necessary for this.
