## REDS CAPTURE THREE ARMIES: TAKE 400 GUNS

Achieve Crushing Victory-Prisoners Total 60,000, Says Dispatch.

WITHDRAW U. S. TROOPS

Report States All American Soldiers Pull Out of Siberia.

LONDON, Jan. 9 .- The town of Krasnoyarak, Eastern Siberia, has been captured by the Bolsheviki, according to a wireless dispatch received here this evening from Moscow. here this evening from Moscow.

"The remnants of the first, second and third enemy armies have surrendered, and 60,000 prisoners already have been counted." says the dispatch. Another communication from Moscow says the booty captured by the Reds on the southern front in Russia in the present offensive include 400 guns. 1,000 machine guns. 11,000 rifles, 18 armored trains, 200 locomotives, 10,000 wagons and large stores of food and munitions and 35,000 prisoners.

Krasnoyarsk is situated on the Trans-Siberian Raliway about 300 miles east of Tomsk. Lying on the plain and open to the play of bitter winds, traf-fic with the town by caravans is al-most impossible in the winter. The town is situated on the left bank of the Yenisei River.


