Building Figures**FOR EIGHT MONTHS****AHEAD OF LAST YEAR****August Showed a Decrease, However, From Figures of a Year Ago.**

Building figures for this city reached a total of \$198,450 for the month of August, in contrast to \$205,040 during a similar period in 1920, a decrease of \$37,590. There were 167 permits issued by Building Inspector Piper during this month.

The above figure brings the total building estimates for the first eight months of this year up to \$1,873,610. During the same eight months of 1920, building figures aggregated \$1,949,340, or \$224,730 more than this year.

Latest permits issued include a one-story basement for the Hale Street Methodist Church, to cost \$10,000; a four-story steel and fireproof partitions for the new Advertiser building on Richmond street, at an estimated cost of \$15,000; and a one-story addition to the Dominion Gas Company's plant on Garfield avenue, costing \$1,000.

MEMORIAL HALL AT**O. A. C. TO HONOR DEAD**

Students Form Entertainment Company To Raise Needed Funds.

To assist in raising funds for a memorial hall at the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, in memory of farm boys who were killed in the war, several of the students have organized a musical company, and have been giving a number of plays throughout Western Ontario.

The company is composed of returned soldiers. G. E. Patton, who is in charge was a German prisoner of war for ten months. John Leggett, who was a member of the war for eighteen months, and has been with the company all season, has left for Paris, France, where he will take a scholarship course in biochemistry, he being one of the candidates to win a scholarship which was given by the French Government to Canadian soldiers.

The company is known as "The Soldiers' Quartet." They have delighted large audiences at the many political meetings and U. F. O. picnics in Western Ontario with their play, "Hello, Ontario." The memorial hall, which is to be erected, will be an auditorium and recreation hall combined for the students of the college.

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Obituaries**DIED ON TUESDAY.****CHEMISTS WARNED AGAINST ALLOWING GERMANS TO LEAD**

Montreal, Aug. 31.—Special warning was given the convention of the Society of Chemical Industry held here, that the industrial chemists of the Anglo-Saxon world, including both the British Empire and the United States must look to it that the position they had achieved during the war was made permanent, and not wrested from them in times of peace by the Germans, as it had been during the pre-war period.

EXPECT VERY LARGE CLASSES AT THE "TECH"

Rearrangement of the Classrooms Will Meet Anticipated Needs of Students.

OPENS THURSDAY NEXT

Commercial Is Now a Three-Year Course—Several New Courses.

Extensive alterations, rearrangements of classrooms and redecoration have been made in the Technical School Building, for the accommodation of the increased number of classes, following the consolidation of the Commercial High School with the London Technical and Art School. The consolidation has been provided for by an amendment to the vocational education act of 1921.

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
