**THE LATE GEO. MINIHELLY**

An old pioneer of Lambton passed away on December 31st, in the person of Mr. George Minielly.

Born in Elmsley township, Lanark county, in 1842, he with his parents, Wm. and Elizabeth Minielly, and the four older brothers and one sister, moved to Plympton township in 1846 and settled on lots 29 and 30, on the London Road. The homestead eventually became the home of himself and his four brothers, and they lived to see the country transformed from an almost solid wood to cleared land and fertile fields.

In 1870 the deceased married Margaret McLachlan, daughter of the late John McLachlan of Lobo township, who survives him. He is also survived by three sons and four daughters, and one brother, John, and also his youngest sister, Miss E. Minielly of Watford. The interment took place at Wyoming Cemetery on Jan. 2, and was attended by a large following of relatives and friends. An old friend, Rev. J. S. Leckie, of Leamington, conducted the service, instead of the local minister, Rev. J. P. McLeod, who is ill. His sons are A. G., R. W. and D. L. Minielly, all of Plympton, and his daughters Mrs. I. J. McKay of Dawn, Mrs. H. J. McLean of Enniskillen, and Mrs. Thos. Simpson and Mrs. Ed. Fleming, both of Plympton.

**Corp. Lewis Killed in Action**

Corp. A. W. Lewis, better known to the people of Watford as Art Lewis, was killed in action on Oct. 8th last. When the United States declared war Art enlisted with the 146th U. S. Field Artillery as a Gun Corporal. His battery fought back of the Marines in the Chateau Thierry fight, until the line was advanced to Loupigne, and was then sent to the St. Mihiel front. From there the battery was sent to Marre on the Verdun front, and was shifted once more to Quizy on Oct. 2.


Six days after reaching Quizy he made the supreme sacrifice, which was caused by a large German shell falling in a pile of American gas shells near the gun Art was firing.

Before Art left he stated, "I will now have a chance to get even with some of that dirty bunch who killed off so many of my Watford school chums." Art had lived in the United States fifteen years but had not forgotten the old town boys.
