Mn. C. A. HOAR, a practical farmer of the United States, mentions a curious instance of the results of cross-breeding, which we commend to the attention of students of animal physiology and the law of heredity. Ho had a choice Suffolk sow which was bred to a thoroughbred Berkshire boar, but the offspring from this union was a good litter of perfectly white pigs—not a colored bristle was found upon one of them. But whom he came to breed from these pigs, they produced black and spotted offspring, though they were brod to a Suffolk boar! There were all grades of color among their progeny, some being perfectly black.

A thoroughbred male, of course, pays his way when used with poor-blooded females; but in a still more marked degree does he pay his way when used with grade or common stock. GRAHAM BREAD.—Half-cup of yeast, a pint of warm milk or water and flour enough to make a thin batter. Let it rise over night. Stir, in the morning, half a cup of sugar, salt, teaspoonful of saleratus dissolved in water and Graham enough to make a very stiff batter. Boiled Flour for Gruel.-Take a pound of flour and tie it as tightly as possible in a pudding cloth. A piece of well-washed, unbleached muslin answers every purpose. Put this tied-up flour into a pot of boiling water and let it boil twelve hours, adding boiling water from time to time; remove the bag and hang roll or pound the flour, which should be very hard and firm; put the grated flour into a closely covered glass jar, and use it as you would cornstarch or arrowroot. This is an admirable food for invalids and for children, especially those suffering from Summer complaint.

Brown Sour .- Take cold roast beef or fowl, cover it with cold water, let this simmer for two hours, then take out the meat and strain the liquid. Have chopped GEO.
