## FRENCH AND ENGLISH COURSES FOR SPOUSES OF ROTATIONAL EMPLOYEES

Just a few words of reminder that summertime is the right time for registration in the second language courses for foreign service employees' spouses, offered by the Official Languages Division. The program is starting its 19th year; hundreds of spouses have participated since its inception.

The courses are offered free of charge. Following a placement test, candidates are grouped in three different levels: beginner and intermediate I and II. Classes are held twice a week, in three hour sessions (six hours a week

in total). Participants may choose between daytime and evening courses, in groups of 6 to 10 students on average. Graduates from the most advanced level may, if they wish, take the official second language examination of the Public Service Commission. Methods are now based on a communicative approach.
