be effective only until the 31st December, 1949, subject, however, to any extension of this arrangement which may be agreed between the two Governments on or before that date; (b) that the temporary suspension of preferences will apply only in respect of goods which are required for specific industrial purposes and are admitted under rebate of duty pursuant to a recommendation of the South African Board of Trade and Industries; and (c) that imports from Canada under tariff sub-heading 270(a) (i) and (ii) will continue to enjoy free entry into the Union of South Africa. The arrangements set out above are acceptable to the Union Government and I now have the honour to propose that this Note and your complimentary reply in similar terms be regarded as constituting an agreement between our two Governments in this matter with effect from the 1st January, 1949.
