PRAYERS.

Mr. Speaker informed the House,—That the Clerk had laid on the Table the Fifth Report of the Examiner of Petitions for Private Bills, which was read as follows:—

Pursuant to Standing Order 99, Section 2, the Examiner of Petitions for Private Bills has the honour to present the following as his Fifth Report:—

Your Examiner has duly examined the following Petition for a Private Bill, and finds that all the requirements of the 95th Standing Order have been complied with in this case, viz:—

Of the Buffalo and Fort Erie Public Bridge Company.

The Clerk of the House laid on the Table the following Private Bill:—

Bill No. 13, An Act respecting the Buffalo and Fort Erie Public Bridge Company.—*Mr. Stinson.*

The said Bill was read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House, pursuant to Standing Order 102.

Mr. Speaker informed the House that Major Milton Fowler Gregg, V.C., M.C. and bar, M.A., had been appointed Sergeant-at-Arms of the House of Commons.

Mr. Sutherland, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Report of the Department of National Defence, Canada, for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1933—Part I—Militia and Air Services, Part II—Naval Service.

On motion of Mr. Bennett, it was ordered,—That Messrs. Stevens, Baribeau, Bell (*St. John-Albert*), Boulanger, Edwards, Factor, Ilsley, Kennedy (*Peace River*), Kennedy (*Winnipeg South Centre*), Senn and Young, form the committee appointed on Friday, the 2nd of February, 1934, to enquire into the causes of spread in prices of commodities, the system of distribution of farm, natural and manufactured products, etc.
