

The House resumed consideration in Committee of the Whole of Bill C-95, An Act to amend the Income Tax Act, and further progress having been made and reported, the Committee obtained leave to consider it again later this day or at the next sitting of the House as the case may be.

Item numbered 62 having been called was allowed to stand at the request of the government.

By unanimous consent, item numbered 101 was withdrawn from the Order Paper.

Mr. Pigeon, seconded by Mr. Winkler, moved,—That an Order of the House do issue for a copy of all correspondence exchanged since April 8, 1963, between the Minister of Public Works or officers of the Department of Public Works, on one hand, and Mr. Roland Comtois, of Repentigny, constituency of Joliette-L'Assomption-Montcalm, on the other hand.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 126*).

And debate arising thereon and continuing;

A Message was received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate had passed Bill C-88, An Act respecting an Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council entitled the Surcharge on Imports Order, and to restore certain rates of Customs duties and tariff benefits expressed to be withdrawn thereby, without amendment.

A Message was received from the Honourable Robert Taschereau, Chief Justice of Canada, in his capacity as Deputy of His Excellency the Governor General, desiring the immediate attendance of the House in the Senate Chamber.

Accordingly, Mr. Speaker, with the House, went to the Senate Chamber.

And being returned;

Mr. Speaker reported that, when the House did attend the Honourable the Deputy of His Excellency the Governor General in the Senate Chamber His Honour was pleased to give, in Her Majesty's name, the Royal Assent to the following bill:

An Act respecting an Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council entitled the Surcharge on Imports Order, and to restore certain rates of Customs duties and tariff benefits expressed to be withdrawn thereby.

The House resolved itself again into Committee of Supply.
