

PRAYERS.

The Honourable Senator Aseltine laid on the Table, the following:—

Annual Report of the Commissioner of Penitentiaries for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1960, pursuant to section 14 of the *Penitentiary Act*, Chapter 206, R.S. 1952. (English text).

The following petition was presented:—

By the Honourable Senator Davies:

Of Queen's University at Kingston; praying for the passing of an Act repealing Section 11 of Chapter 123 of the Statutes of 1882 and substituting therefor, the following:—

“11. There shall be a Vice-Chancellor of the University who may or may not be the Principal. In the absence of the Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor shall take his place and discharge his duties.”

The following petitions were severally read and received:—

Of Kenneth Harrison Burgis and others of the City of Calgary, in the Province of Alberta; praying to be incorporated under the name of “Aurora Pipe Line Company”.

Of Reginald Bedford, of the City of Hamilton, in the Province of Ontario, and others of elsewhere; praying to be incorporated under the name of “Canadian Federation of Music Teachers' Associations”.
