The Central Board earnestly hope that both Clergymen and Laymen will give a careful and favourable consideration to the position of this Fund and the strong claims which it presents for a generous support.

ENDOWMENT.

DEPOSITORY.

The number of books sold during the year shows that the Depository is in a satisfactory condition.
