The lesson to be derived from the foregoing figures is very clear and shows that English speaking people are gradually leaving the rural districts of Quebec while the French Canadian people are becoming more attached to them.

Now, what does this constant exodus of English speaking people teach us? To me it means that success can only be secured in Quebec by adopting the language of the majority, viz., FRENCH and becoming one of them. Even as it would be impossible to reach the English of England through the French language, even so, it is impossible to reach the French Canadian by the use of English.

What Does This Teach Us?

It should teach us that it is useless trying to ignore or root up conditions planted nearly 400 years ago. We might just as well try to stop the ocean tides. The FRENCH CANADIAN was here before us and will be here after we are dead and buried. He has proved himself to be a very desirable fellow-citizen and countryman. Then why try to force him to do business with you in English. Its no use saying that Uncle Sam assimilated all foreign languages and we should do the same. Conditions are not equal, neither are cases similar.
