## Cricket Records

Bonhag Lowers Mark That Has  
Stood for 21 years by 7 Secs.

NEW YORK, June 4.—Chief among the high-class track and field marks accomplished yesterday at the annual spring games of the New York Athletic Club at Travers Island, was the smashing of the three-mile running record by George Bonhag of the Irish-American A.C., who did 14.32, wiping out Willie Day's mark of 14.39, made twenty-one years ago. **New Hurdle Record.**  
NEW YORK, June 4.—John J. Eller, the Irish-American Athletic Club, today champion hurdler, lowered the American record to 22.5 seconds for 75 yards over low hurdles by one-fifth of a second, Celtic Park today. He ran his trial and final heats in 31.6 seconds.  
The feature event of the day was 150 metre scratch race, at the finish of which Abel Kiviat of the Irish-American Athletic Club breasted the tape scarcely a

University of Pennsylvania. It was a grueling finish, one of the best and closest seen on a running track here in years. Melvin W. Sheppard also started in this event, but the best he could do was to finish fifth in a field of six starters. The winner's time was 4:02 2-5, which is 42-5 seconds behind the world's record.

W. J. Hayes of Philadelphia, who was unattached, won the final heat of the 100 yards handicap from scratch in 31.4-5 seconds, rather handily, after he had done two-fifths of a second better in his trial heat.
