Lord Strathcona on rising to propose the toast to the King received great applause. N. A. Belcourt, M. P., proposed the toast to the Queen and the rest of the royal family.

The Earl of Jersey proposed the Imperial Forces. He said Canada had set an example the empire should follow.

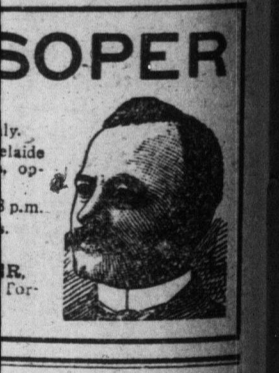
