WARWICKS' HAVE CONTRACT GIVE MUCH BETTER TERMS.

Legal Doubt as to Whether Printing of Revised Statutes is in Contract

Hon. Mr. Matheson handed out the following statement relative to the contract for printing the R.S.O. yesterday: "The government has arranged with Warwick Bros. & Rutter for the printing of the revised statutes of Ontario, which will be published in three volumes of about 1700 pages each. The volumes of the revised statutes will be printed on a much more substantial paper than the last issue, which went to press very easily. There will be about 1000 more pages in the event of a reprint of 1897 and 12,000 sets will be required instead of 10,000. A special rate has been arranged for the publication, very considerably below the rate which would have prevailed if the work had been done under the general printing contract. "The government looked into the question as to whether the printing of the revised statutes came within the general printing contract, and they obtained the opinion of counsel on the matter, but as there was considerable doubt about the point and the damages would have been heavy in the event of the court deciding that the present contractors were entitled to print these statutes, they decided to give the printing to Warwick Bros. & Rutter, they having made very considerable concessions both as to price and as to the quality of the work. "It is expected that the cost of the whole issue will not exceed that of the last issue, in spite of there being one thousand more pages and three volumes instead of two."

HAMILTON HAPPENINGS LEAVES NOTE TO FIND BODY WOMAN SUICIDES IN BAY

Aldermen Inspect Lamps of Rival Companies on Market Square - Man Hurt on Car Platform.

Hamilton, Oct. 5.—(Special)—This afternoon Mrs. Patterson, 205 North Hughson-street, found the following note on the Hughson-street bridge: "From Detroit two days ago, Oct. 1, 1905, you will find me in the bay at the Turbina dock." The note was handed over to the police, who had scarcely finished reading it when they were notified that the body of a woman had been found at the Turbina dock. The body is that of a woman between 45 and 50 years of age, brown hair, dark clothes, a rubber stocking covering a sore on the left leg, and wearing three rings on her fingers. The police have been unable so far to identify her. "This evening the aldermen inspected sample lamps of three rival companies that are seeking a contract for 250 boulevard lamps. The lamps were erected on the Central Market. Prof. Leitch, scientific test, but will not announce the result until Saturday. Mrs. Dr. Woolverton, the first supervisor, Mrs. Newcombe, her successor, and Miss Savage received the visitors. Addresses were delivered by Inspector W. H. Ballard, Mrs. J. L. Hughes, Toronto; Rev. J. K. Hamilton, and Alfred Ward, a member of the school board. The annual games of the asylum were held this afternoon.

Burned With Acid. Miss Eulaha Somerville, 368 Jackson-street, was painfully burned on both hands and arms while taking a bottle of carbolic acid from nine-year-old Evelyn Locke, who attempted to drink from the bottle, thinking that it contained water. It is said that being to an understanding with the "Pocket Company" neither "Trustee" Lambois nor Ald. Witton will run for public honors again. The charge of manslaughter against Harry McDonald and the charge of sheep stealing against A. Hammer, the grocer's case, and many other cases, will be taken up at the fall sittings which open on Monday afternoon.

Reeve Summoned. Reeve Ptolemy of Saltfleet Township has been summoned to police court Tuesday on the charge of wilful damage. He, with some of the township councilors, tore down a fence that the city erected on the road, between the filtering basins. The city secured patents for the land from the government. Joseph Myers, the alleged pickpocket arrested at the race-track, was allowed out on \$200 bail, and he has left the city. J. M. Robinson, a member of the board of education, is out for the job of assessor.

WHY THE LIGHT BURNS LOW Gas Company Just at Present Have Too Heavy Custom.

A letter to the mayor from a resident of Parkdale complains of the poor gas service, saying: "For the past three weeks or so, between the hours of 5.30 p. m. and 8.30 or 9 p. m., it is absolutely impossible to use the gas for cooking purposes, as there is no pressure, and there is not one of the gas jets in the whole house that I can get down any read comfortably by during those hours, and my eyesight is pretty good. About midnight the light is all that could be desired."

To the World, last night, W. H. Pearson, general manager of the Consumers Gas Company, said: "I am well aware that the supply of gas in different parts of the city is inadequate at the hours mentioned. This is accounted for by the exceedingly rapid growth of the city and the great number of people using gas, and in addition to that, both stores and private houses use gas at 6 o'clock now, and we are not able to provide a great enough pressure. "We are doing all in our power, however, to remedy this. Our new gasometer on Trinity-street will be completed in ten days, which will give us a much higher pressure for Parkdale, and in addition to this we are laying larger mains all over the city, and many of these will be completed in a fortnight."

The custodian of the royal library in Vienna found, the other day, in a pile of unsorted parchment, a valuable manuscript of the thirteenth century—about 300 lines of a verified translation of the Bible into the Bavarian-Alemannic dialect made by Rudolf von Emms in Switzerland.
