Northern Pacific Railway, to the Columbia River. For three years the

railway was a failure, but in 1894 the rush towards Trail and Roseland began

in earnest, and Mr. Corbin now finds his railway a valuable asset.

But the railway has done little times as much as Mr. Corbin. It afforded a means of access to the gold and silver mines of the Kootenay

country and brought thousands of people and millions of capital into the country. If the Spokane Falls and Northern Pacific had never been built it is pretty certain there would have been no Roseland, at least no Roseland of world-wide fame. After this railway was constructed another

American, Mr. Heinze, came upon the scene and laid a track from Roseland to Trail, on the Columbia River. Furthermore, he erected a smelter that is treating 300 or 400 tons of ore per day. Later still Mr. Corbin extends the Spokane Falls and Northern Pacific way to Roseland, adding 20 miles of track and giving Roseland direct connection with the great railway system of North America. It is to the enterprise of these Americans that we owe the wonderful progress that the Kootenay country has made during the last few years.
