MANNER IN WHICH CITY GRANTS MADE

A Special Committee Recommends Change in System.

The question of "lump sum" versus "per diem" grants to charitable institutions where indigents are kept will be left to the tender mercies of the voters of this city, who will be asked at the polls whether they desire to make grants to public institutions in an agregate amount to cover the estimated cost of the care of the indigens, or to put the matter of such grants on a basis of "so much per day" for each patient, as is done in the best hotels. The above action was decided upon at a meeting of the special committee appointed to consider the question of grants on Friday afternoon. Only those grants exceeding \$300 are included in the pian, those under that amount being left to the decision of the council as in the past.

In addition to the vote on the manner of making grants, two other bylaws will be submitted, one authorizing an additional grant of \$5,000 to the Salvation Army Rescue Home, and another to cover a grant of \$600 to the Submitted. The committee decided to recommend to the city council that all institutions where charity patients are cared for, such as the rescue homes, orphanaes, etc., will be paid on the per diem basis, but will pay for all city patients at the region rate. For hospitals, as an example, the rate is \$1.25 a day. The city will pay that for all bona fide city patients. It is the opinion that other municipalities send patients to many institutions as in the past.

Speedy Examination Most Essential, Declare Officers at Headquarters.

Great emphasis is being laid by the military authorities upon the necessity confronting every man who is eligible for service under the military service act of presenting himself for a physical examination before the medical officer at the central pages of the service pages of the central pages of the t the centre nearest to his place o at the centre hearest to his place of residence.

"The first thing for every man between the specified ages to do is to be examined," said a member of the staff at military headquarters to The Advertiser. "Beginning on Monday next, when the medical boards throughout the district will all be in full operation, every man should present himself, and find out where he stands. At present only the centres at London and Windsor are examining men, but on Monday next all six boards in this district will begin to work. Every man who comes before the board will be given a copy of his medical history sheet, informing




