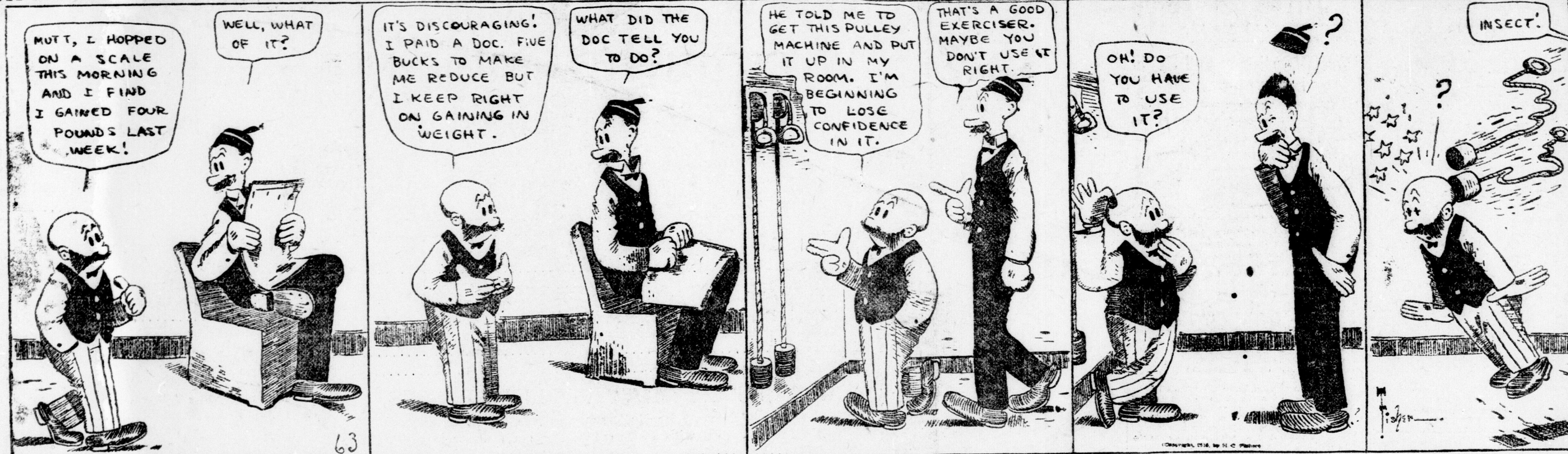

ONTARIO CURLING ASSOCIATION ADD FOUR NEW CUPS

Alliston, Coldwater, Thornbury and Millbrook Added to Club List at Annual Meeting.

TORONTO, Oct. 28.—Four new clubs were elected to membership in the Ontario Curling Association at the association's annual meeting here today. They are Alliston, Coldwater, Thornbury and Millbrook. In connection with the grouping, four new districts were added, making twelve in all.

Rule 2 of the Ontario Tankard was changed so that if only three clubs were entered they should each play the other, and one that wins to count first. In case of ties, points to count.

It was also decided that four new cups be provided so that there be one for each district in the district cup competition.

RUSSIAN "REDS" AND "ANTIS" BOTH CLAIM SUBSTANTIAL WINS

Bolshevik Message Records Decisive Advance On Petrograd Front.

LONDON, Oct. 28.—The Red forces have started a decisive advance along the entire Petrograd front, according to a Bolshevik communiqué received here. They have rapidly recaptured Krasnoe Selo and other villages.

General Denikin's wireless communication reports that an advance is developing between the Motveditza and the Kholm Rivers, where 800 prisoners have been taken. Many Reds were drowned. One communist regiment was annihilated.

"We abandoned Kromy," the dispatch adds, "after severe fighting." A wireless message from Moscow says that a group of international bankers has advanced to Admiral Kolchak a credit of \$50,000,000.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 28.—Showing no ill effects from his recent activities, President Wilson spent today quietly, and continued his recent progress toward recovery. No executive business was brought to the president's attention during the day.

Vote of Confidence Given To Government in Britain

LONDON, Oct. 28.—The Government tonight received a vote of confidence in the House of Commons. The bill renewing the powers of the defence of the realm act was under discussion. Sir Frederick Bantury, having obtained the speaker's indorsement of the bill, moved the adjournment of the debate to secure withdrawal and the substitution of a new bill. Andrew Bonar Law, the Government spokesman, basing himself on the speaker's admission that the bill could be remedied in committee, refused to withdraw the bill, and made the question one of confidence. The Bantury motion was then rejected by a vote of 238 to 77.

PRINCE ENTERTAINED A SECOND TIME BY MONTREAL CITIZENS

Expresses Appreciation of Unity Between Races.

GREAT POSSIBILITIES

Canada Destined to Become as Great a Nation as Britain Itself.

MONTREAL, Oct. 28.—The Prince of Wales was this afternoon entertained at a civic luncheon at the Place Viger Hotel, at which he met nearly 500 of the city's most prominent professional and business men. Hon. Modeste Massé, president of the luncheon, and after the toast of the Prince of Wales his royal highness spoke as follows:

"Mr. Mayor: I am happy to be able to return to Montreal, and I thank you for your generous hospitality in entertaining me to a second luncheon. I was particularly touched, Mr. Mayor, with one passage of the address in which you welcomed me yesterday, the passage in which you referred to the mutual understanding between English-speaking and French-speaking citizens of the Canadian nation (applause). That is a matter that I had very much at heart when I landed, but having traversed the great Dominion from coast to coast I have it, if possible, more at heart now than ever before (applause)."

Not Mere Convenience. "The union of the two races in Canada was never a matter of mere political convenience. On the contrary, it was and will ever remain an example of the highest political wisdom, for which the Empire owes an incalculable debt to Cartier, to MacDonald and to other great statesmen of both races who brought this union about (applause)."

"Much has been written and said about the successful way the British

Empire has established political unions between races of different language and different history. The unions in Canada and South Africa are only later examples of the political union between England and Scotland, and that brought Great Britain itself into existence as a political unity.

Only Half Century. "The union between England and Scotland has lasted through centuries. The union between the British and French races in Canada has only lasted half a century, but who can doubt that the union in Canada will produce as great, as powerful and as united a nation as the British nation itself (applause)."

"None can read Canadian history, much less traverse the Dominion as I have for the last four months, without realizing that the spirit and genius of both races is closely interwoven throughout the Dominion, and not only in the east, but in the west do both races share the honors of early exploration and early settlement.

Many Claims. "Montreal has many claims to admiration. It is the largest center of population and of business in the whole of Canada, and I have been very much impressed and interested in all that I have seen. I have been specially touched, and I especially appreciate the wonderful welcome which I have received here for the second time. And what I value most in that welcome is the fact that it was given with equal warmth by citizens of both great races that are represented here in Montreal. (Applause)."

"The city has the distinction of being in this respect typical of the union of races in the Dominion as a whole, and, therefore, I value that welcome in a very special way. "I think, through you, Mr. Mayor, all the citizens, British and French, young and old, rich and poor, very, very sincerely, the royal highness repeated the last few sentences of this in French and concluded by saying:

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"I hope that I shall return often to Canada, (loud cheers), and I hope to return often to Montreal, and so I will only say au revoir." (Cheers.)

The prince then proposed the health of the mayor, and the function concluded with cheers for his royal highness.

STRIKE PREVENTS SHIPS COALING IN NEW YORK; DIVERTED TO HALIFAX

HALIFAX, N.S., Oct. 28.—A number of steamers, bound to or from New York, have been diverted to Halifax for coal on account of the New York waterfront strike. The Lapland, from Southampton for New York, is expected here Thursday for bunkers, and the Baltic, from Southampton for New York, will be due here November 5. The Mauretania, now at New York, will call here next Friday on her way to England.



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
