HAMILTON, May 3.—(Special).—The Conservative delegates from East and West Hamilton met Saturday night to nominate candidates for the legislature. Hon. J. S. Hendrie, nominated by George S. Lynch Staunton, K.C., and William Berry, a prominent labor man, William Berry, a prominent labor man, was given an ovation and was declared the choice of the convention without any other name being mentioned.
