Leon Delagrande Remains in the Air Almost Half an Hour-Traveled Over 15 Miles.

PARIS, Sept. 7.-Leon Delagrange resident of the Aviation Club of ne record, made yesterday. He circled the field at Issy eighteen mes at an average height of 13 feet,

and remained in the air 31 minutes.

Sunday's Performance.

Leon Delagrange, president of the Aviation Club of France, had established a new world's record with his aeroplane at Issy yesterday morning, both for length and duration of flight. M. Delagrange remained in the air for 29 minutes 54 4-5 seconds, and circled the field fifteen and one-half times, covering a distance of 24,727 metres, or about fifteen and one-quarter miles. He thus beat the longest flight previously made, that by Henry Farman in July, by 9 minutes 34 1-5 seconds, and exceeded the distance covered by Wilbur Wright Friday by about one and three-quarter miles. The new records have been accepted officially.

M. Delagrange's sensational flight, which closely approaches the longest unofficial flights claimed by the Wright brothers in the United States, is rendered still more impressive by the fact that he came down only because the fluid used for his motor became exhausted. He carried twenty-four litres in a tank and practically every door in a tank, and practically every drop of it was used. When he cut off the power he came lightly to the earth.
