The romantic marriage of Princess Elizabeth of Bavaria, granddaughter of the Prince Regent, had a happy sequel. After 16 years of banishment the prin-710 cess, who chose to marry a Protestant lieutenant, has been permitted to re-

turn to the Bavarian court. The princess, who is a Catholic, fell in love in 1893 with Lieut. Baron Siegfried auf Buttenheim. Her parents, Prince Leopold of Bavaria and Arch-duchess Gisela of Austria, refused to consent to the wedding. Consequently, the couple fied together to Italy and were married at Milan. Meanwhile a warrant had been issued for the arrest of the lieufenant in case he should re-2,200 turn to Bavaria.
