WAS DULLEST DAY ON STOCK MARKET

Total Transactions Were Smallest Since December of 1918.

New York, June 29.—Business on the stock exchange today was the dullest since December, 1918, with a total of about 20,000,000 shares traded.

In all other respects the market was merely a repetition of recent days. Share prices were alternately irregular and close on short covering in steel and oils.

Many of the usual favorites in the several speculative groups were altogether ignored and net changes among the most fractional in no important instance exceeding a point.

Local bank and federal reserve preliminary shifting of deposits in anticipation of July interest and dividend disbursements were reflected in lighter time rates. Nine per cent was bid for 30 and 60-day accommodation with few offers.

Base rate was shown by the call money market, but this wholly attributable to light demand. Early loans to firms, a steady tone prevailed at the close on short covering in steel, steel and oils.

Statements of earnings for May embraced some of the more important railroad systems. The figures were mixed, however, Southern Pacific, for example, showing a large gain in net, while Atlantic Coast Line reported unusually low earnings.

Trade in bonds was relatively large, the domestic list, including Liberty bonds, again leading, with foreign flotations, notably Anglo-French 5's and 6's, were firm. Total sales (par value) aggregated \$13,200,000. Old U. S. bonds, unchanged on call.
