Lexington, Ky., Oct. 14.—The card of the five races on go-away day at the Grand Circuit meeting here was a most interesting one, and surprises were furnished in the 3.05 pace and three-year-old trot. The first race was won by Pleasant, their fields. The features were the 2.95 trot, won in straight heats by the favorite, Nedda, and the 3.05 pace, in which Louis Gratton, winner of the free-for-all pace, was forced to lower her colors to the very margin of eligibility.

The three-year-old trot was conceded to Natalie the Great by experts, but she was badly off form, and Plausible took the second and third heats when Natalie broke. The first division of the 2.17 trot was won by the favorite Mightth, but not until after Hohobak had beaten her in the first heat.

Mightth, by her victory, became the only trot winner of the meeting.

The second division of the 2.17 trot went four heats, with The Great McGregor the winner in the first and second, and race the 2.05 trot, a three-heat affair.

By Nedda, with the erratic Charley Rex as her only challenger, the favorite Charley got away fast on the outside in the first heat, and led all the way until well into the second heat, when Nedda overhauled him in a vigorous drive.

At the close of the day's racing, the two yearlings of horses are expected to leave Friday for the Grand Circuit, the final meeting of the Grand Circuit season.
