CATTLE MARKET CLOSES STEADY TO STRONG High Prices for the Week Fully Maintained.

With a light run of cattle at the Union Yards yesterday, around 500 head, the market for practically all classes held steady to strong with Wednesday's prices.

There are some who credit the market during the last two days with ranging from the way from 25c to 50c higher and the size-up is justified by the results.

We are passing through a period of very strong prices undoubtedly, as everybody knows, but there must be some limit to the price at which cattle can sell locally.

The Toronto market is out of line with the American market as a well known fact, but there is no apparent let-up, or was not this week.

Top prices are running around \$15 and \$15.50 for extra choice lots of good butchers and some good prices have been paid for cattle 50c back on the grass to freshen up, \$12.50 to \$14.

Some good loads of butchers and feeders sold around from \$12.50 to \$14.50, and a feature of the market is the strength of choice butcher cows and butcher bulls, the buyers for some of the plants paying up as high as \$12, and one cow sold by Rice & Whaley brought \$13.50.

Good to choice milk cows and springers are selling at satisfactory prices.

There is also an active demand for breeder steers and thin young cows for the grass, despite the fact that the outlook for grass is not very promising in the near future.

As far as can be judged the outlook for steady prices unless we should have a heavy run on Monday, and this is not at all likely.

In the small calf market there is not much change to report. The sheep and lamb market has eased off from 25c to 30c and the pig market remains as it was, with a heavy decline in prices on Monday.

There were from 2 1/2 to 3c a pound, held about steady since the time the calf market is weak and slow and a packing contract to a week or two ago.
