Course of Education.—Greek, Latin, French, Mathematics, Natural Philosophy, History and Chronology—Ancient, Mediseval and Modern; Geography—Ancient, Modern and Physical; Use of the Globes; Arithmetic, Mental Arithmetic, Book keeping, Geometrical Drawing, Surveying and Perspective, Ornamental Drawing Singing and Instrumental Music-in addition to the ordinary branches of English with composition in English, and in Greek and Latin Prose and Verse.

The necessary Books, and Drawing Materials, are procurable at the College Bookseller's, Mr. H. Rowsell, at the expense of the pupil.

The Commercial Department—has lately been introduced as a branch connected ith the College. In this department pupils can devote their time exclusively to with the College. studies appertaining to commerce; or they can unite therewith, if desired, the study of French, Mathematics, Natural Philosophy, Singing and Instrumental

Music, without any additional fee.

The Resident School House-has been opened, and is conducted under statute, rules and ordinances made by the College Council. The School-house is an integral part of the Institution, and under the sole and entire management and supervision of the Council, who "require that all boys coming from a distance and having melations in town with whom they can live, should reside on the premises, either with one of the Masters, or in the Resident School-house." There are three College Master living in the Resident School-house, one of whom is constantly with the boys Each boy has a separate sleeping apartment, and none but men servants are imployed in the School-house. The members of Council have consented to act for week at a time each, with the Principal, as Visitors; and the College Masters in diving in the Resident School-house act in rotation as Censors; the most perfect order is thus secured-in short, everything has been done which the Council con sidered would make the Resident School-house worthy of the entire confidenced those who, living at a distance from Toronto, desire that their sons should enjoy with safety the advantages which Upper Canada College, as a Provincial Institution now offers to the Province at large.
