

Russia has 1,600,000 men under arms, mainly concentrated along the western frontier from the Baltic to the Black Sea, while the Baltic States have only 120,000 men under their colors and Poland 260,000, according to figures compiled here. These figures, it is stated, have been brought out in connection with the present conference of representatives of the Baltic States and Poland at Reval, in preparation for taking part in the Moscow disarmament congress proposed by Foreign Minister Tchitcherin.

The newspaper Kurjer Porany declares in this connection that Russia has agreements with the Krupps under which arms and munitions are being produced on a considerable scale in their Russian works, it being reported that the factory at Tula is turning out 20,000 rifles and 30,000,000 cartridges monthly, while the establishment at Putilovo is producing several hundred pieces of heavy artillery yearly.
