Lord Morris expressed much interest in recent developments concerning the British embargo on Canadian cattle. He said that during his regime as premier of Newfoundland large numbers of cattle had been imported into the colony from the dominion, but diseased cattle had never been discovered.

Lord Morris predicted that within a few years Newfoundland would enter the Canadian confederation. He is accompanied on his trip by his son, Hon. Michael Morris.




