SHABBY TREATMENT.
To the Editor of The Times:
Sir,—On April 23 last a letter was received by the local office of the employment service of Canada from H. Herford, Ottawa, stating that the office would be closed on Saturday, the 24th inst., but that salaries would be paid until the end of the month.
Seven days' notice was given the returned men in that office one, at least of whom had successfully passed the senior civil service examinations immediately on his return after four years of service in the ranks of an infantry battalion in France.
William Fox, secretary to the Civil Service Commission, in his reply to one of the men who asked what prospect there was that he be placed in another department, stated that he would be kept in mind for a position at a salary of \$960 or considerably less than he had been receiving. In other words, this man passed his examinations and yet did not receive as favorable treatment from the commission as other men did who did not pass. This service has not yet been paid the money they earned for the month of April.
This is hardly creditable to the Dominion of Canada.

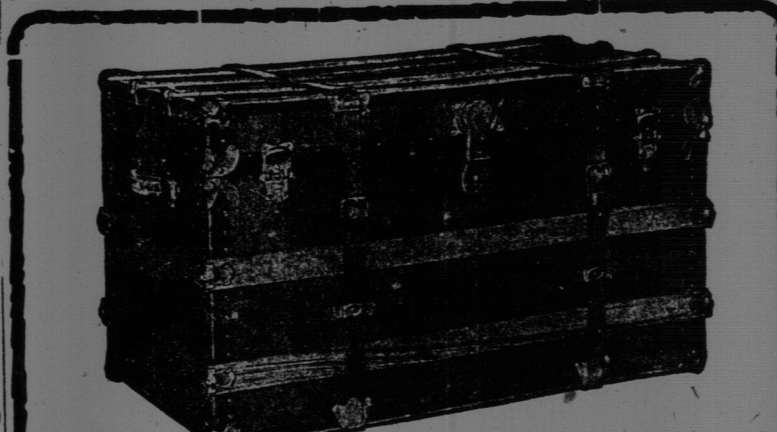
MEMORIALS TO CANADIAN DEAD

Ottawa, May 6.—On eight different battlefields in Europe memorials are to be erected to Canada's fighting dead. The total cost of the work is estimated roughly at \$1,500,000. The committee has selected eight sites for the memorials. In Belgium, sites at St. Julien, Crest Farm, Passchendaele and at Hill 62, Observatory ridge have been accepted as gifts from the Belgian government. A site at Bourlon Wood has been accepted as a gift from Comte De Francoeurville, Mayor of Bourlon, and four other sites, at Hill 145, Vimy, at the cross roads of Dury, at Courcellette and at Hospital Wood between Caix and La Chesnel have been acquired by the committee at a total cost of \$1,500,000.

COTTON WAGES MATTER IN ENGLAND SETTLED.

Manchester, May 7.—The wages dispute in the cotton trade, which involved 400,000 operatives, has been settled. The operatives have been granted an increase of 28 1/2 per cent with an additional ten per cent to mate card-room workers. The agreement is to last twelve months.

AIRPLANES FOR FISHING.
The U. S. navy department will cooperate with the menhaden fishermen who plan to utilize airplanes to assist them in spotting huge schools of the fish to the extent of allowing the aviation field of the naval base at Hampton Roads, No. naval aviators will be employed in the work of scouting for the fish, but all of the government's data collected on hundreds of flights of the Virginia coast will be placed at the disposal of the fishing concerns.
The menhaden fishing industry is one of the largest on Chesapeake Bay. There are fifteen or twenty large factories engaged throughout the year in converting the catch of a fleet of twenty-five or more trawlers into oil and fertilizer. Hundreds of men are employed, including experienced fishermen and seamen who annually catch scores of thousands of menhaden.
The aviator will fly out in advance of the fishing fleet, circle in great arcs covering hundreds of square miles and signal by wireless when he sights the schools. As plans progress more aviators and more fishing trawlers will be employed, and where the gregarious menhaden are now scooped by the ship they will then be caught by the ship load.
