RECENT DEATHS

After about a year's illness the death occurred yesterday of Esther A. Seely, wife of S. F. Seely, of Carleton. Mrs. Seely was daughter of Edward L. Burns, of this city. Besides her husband she leaves three small children. Interment will be made on Thursday afternoon at Campbell's Settlement, Kings county.

Dr. Bliss S. Thorne of Havelock, Kings county, passed away yesterday afternoon. He was seventy-one years of age and had been ill for a long time. Dr. Thorne was of Loyalist descent and was a nephew of the late Dr. Alexander Ward who served as mayor of St. John for three terms. His father died in Middleton, N. S., two years ago at the age of ninety-six.

Dr. Thorne was a member of the Canadian Medical Association and was formerly vice-president of the New Brunswick Medical Society. He was formerly high physician for the High Court of the I. O. F.

After practicing here from 1864 until 1889, Dr. Thorne removed to Sackville, where he remained until 1895, when he returned to Havelock. He was twice married. His first wife was Miss Susan M. Keith, daughter of the late Charles Keith, of New Canada, Queens county, to whom he was married Oct. 17, 1868. She died in 1888. They had four children, three of whom, two sons and a daughter, died early in life. In 1889, Dr. Thorne married Miss Bessie Price, daughter of the late John C. Price, of

Havelock, who survives him. He also leaves a sister, Mrs. Robert H. Caldwell, of Middleton (N. S.); a son, Dr. Van Buren Thorne, of the editorial staff of the New York Times, and two grand-children.

The death of Howard Jackson, of Wilson's Beach, occurred at his home on January 20. He was a native of Woodstock, N. B., and is survived by a wife, six sons and one daughter.

Mrs. Mary, widow of Norman McLeod, of Carletonville, N. B., died yesterday, aged 65 years.

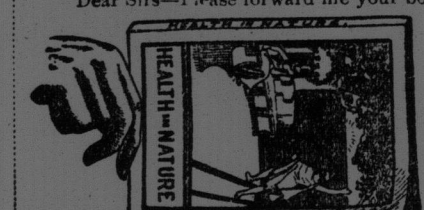

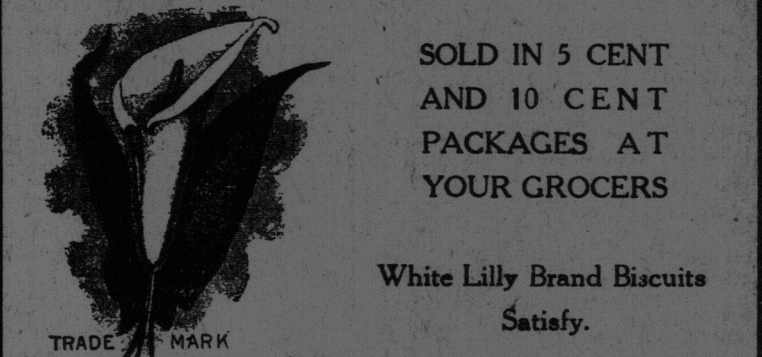
