"The painful situation in which your
Lordhaty has long been placed, and the personal relation in which you have been made to stand towards the House of Assembly,
form no slight addition to the embarrassments which obstruct the successful termi however, io your Lordship to state that from Lone first assumption of the Government of
Lower Cinada, my predecessors in the Department over which 1 now preside, have
significd their general approbation of the conduct you have pursued in the Adminis-
tration of the affairs of that Province. With satifaction I add that from an examination commencing at tise period referred to, I can
 de obvious that the exasperated feelings so on of that branch of the Canadian Legislaure from the Executive Government, have rendered your Lordship's position so ex-
tremely difficult as even to forbid the hope that you would be enabled to employ with any goou effect the words of conciliation and peace. Looking then at the manner of bearing in mind the circumstances to which I have already adiverted, His Majesty's G ${ }^{2}$ ernment are of opinion that the exigencles
of the case demand some more decisive and expeditious jode of proceeding than is pondence. Your Lordship's sentiments
have been more than ouce expressed to the same effect. The King has therefore been humbly ad
vised to selcct an individual possessing His Majesty's tutire confidence, who has the advantage of being unconnected with past Ca-
nadiaa politics, and has had the opportunity by recent personal communication with the
members of Mis Majesty's Government, o scertaining theic views and intentions more fully and unteservedly than could be possi-
bile by means of written statements. This individual, in the capacity of His Majesty's Rpyal Commissioner, will repair Lo Lower Canada fully instrucled to examine, points of discussiun, in the hope of composing all those differences which have so lon
agitated the Province, and which have deep ly aflicted His Majesty's loyal subjects. ship even an outline of the instructions of which His Majesty's Extraordinary Comficieat to inform you that his mission will gating any new principles of Government, as of carrying into effiect that system of live rality and justice, towards the people or
Lower Canada, which His Majesty thas long since adupted, and whe
the House of Comimons recently declared had characterised the policy and conduct of had characterised
all those by whom the affairs of this King
dom have been administered during the las dom have been administered during the last
six years, although the result which has hisix years, although the restorts might perhaps
therto attended these effor render our hopes of the future less sanguiue, it will not diminish of the King to satisfy all just claims and expectations of his Canadian subjects. They will find that His Majesty is unwearied in his enceavours to estabilsh "an im-
partial, conciliatory and constitutional Go vernment in Canada." For this enc it will be the object of His Majesty to renew an enquiry into every alleged grievance, to exa-
mine every cause of complaint, and to a remedy to every abuse that may still be found to prevail; for this end there is no sacrifice he would not cheerfully make which should be compatible with the fundamental principles of the Constitution isself, and with
the continued existence of the Province as a possession of the British Jrown. I am unwilling to believe that the Canadian people can be insensible to feelings so truly paterhave not been recently adopted or on the spur of the cceasion, and for which we may
reasonably hope that His. Majesty will be
