B. C. VOTES FOR GOV'T **CONTROL OF LIQUOR**

Reaction of Prohibition Results in Big Win For "Wets."

British Columbia declared strongly "yes" in favor of more lenient liquor legislation. The Prohibition Act, which has been in force for the past three years, was, overwhelming by defeated in the provincial referendum vote in practically all parts of the province. City districts vied with rural municipalities in piling up majorities in favor of Government control and sale. It looks as if final faures will five three-fifths, if not two-thirds, majority in favor of the Moderationists, as the party which fought the battle against total prohibition siyed themselves. Two questions were put on the ballot paper, the first asking if the voter favored the continuance of the present Prohibition Act or whether is favored the system of Government centrol and sale.

For weeks platforms throughout the province had rung with denunciations and counter dedunciations of the workerts, and to the very end the best judges were disincilined to say which way, it would so. The general opinion was that the figures would be narrow either way, but on the whole prohibition, owing to the women's vote, would carry the day. 
