COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ST. JOHN RIVER DIFFICULTIES; MR. J. F. GREGORY'S EVIDENCE

The commission to inquire into the difficulties arising in regard to the St. John river where it forms the boundary between Maine and Canada convened here yesterday morning.

Those present were Messrs. Peter C. Keegan and H. H. Murchie, the representatives of the American government; A. P. Barnhill (chairman) and John Keeffe, the Canadian representative; Hon. T. F. Fellows, counsel for the Americans; Messrs. W. P. Jones and Mr. A. J. Gregory, counsel for the Canadian commissioners; and Mr. J. Fraser Gregory, representing the St. John River Log Driving Company.

Mr. Jones submitted as evidence the charter of the Madawaska Log Driving Company, with its subsequent amendments. The next half hour was taken up with the identification of the different exhibits used in the evidence by both sides.

Mr. J. Fraser Gregory, examined by Mr. Jones, said: Last season there was a large number of logs hung up at or about Big Rapids. There were about 8,000,000 feet of the St. John Lumber Company's logs, and there were about 12,000,000 feet of Murray and Gregory's.

A portion of these logs was forced up on the banks last February and while some come out this spring, a large number of them were forced higher up on the bank and had to be moved by a contractor. There had never, to his knowledge, been any sorting of logs in the main St. John river previous to that done at the sorting works of the St. John Lumber Company.

There had been some sorting of cedar on the St. Francis and the other tributaries. At no time would this cedar exceed three or four millions of feet. There was less of this sorting being done now than formerly.

Mr. Fellows pointed out that Mr. Gregory, when stating that no logs had been sorted in the main river previous to the establishment of the works at Van Buren, had forgotten about the booms at Fredericton. Mr. Gregory laughingly made the necessary qualification.

RUSHING WORK DRUMMOND RD. TO IRON MINES

Track Cleared to Within Short Distance of Black Cut--More Than One Hundred and Fifty Men Are at Work at Present Time.

Bathurst, July 20--A court of arbitration, consisting of Messrs. A. J. H. Stewart, J. J. S. Hackey of Bathurst, and Edward Fitzpatrick of Carleton Place, sat last week to settle a dispute between the Drummond Iron Mines Co. and Messrs. George Glendinning and Mrs. Connolly concerning lands belonging to the latter required for a Y to connect their line of railway with the I. R. C. at Black Cut.

After hearing several witnesses, including Mr. Taylor, engineer in charge of construction, and others, and viewing the two pieces of land, three acres, belonging to Glendinning and five to Mrs. Connolly, they recommended for saving of expense, that the parties accept the offer of the company, viz. five hundred to Glendinning and four hundred to Connolly, the company paying costs of court up to time of recommendation. The terms were accepted and settlement effected.
