WORKERS NEEDED FOR SPHAGNUM MOSS PICKING AND SORTING

Anywhere from one hundred to five hundred workers will be needed in the work of gathering and sorting the sphagnum moss.

At present five circles meet every day for sorting with eight members of the Junior N. B. S. members.

PRESIDENT WILSON'S ATTITUDE TOWARDS WOMAN SUFFRAGE

Expresses Hope That Senate Will Pass Suffrage Amendment Before End of Session.

Washington, D. C. June 13—President Wilson today expressed the hope that the Senate would pass the Woman Suffrage amendment at the present session of Congress.

"It is my earnest hope," the President said, "that the Senate of the United States will give an unmistakable answer to this question by passing the Suffrage amendment to the Federations Union before the end of the session."
