ALL PARTIES BACK
ADMIRAL KOLCHAK
The Constitutional Demo-
cratic Party Urges All to
Unite Around the Admiral
in the Name of Unity and
Independence of Russia.
Omak, Wednesday, May 21—(Rus-
sian Telegraphic Agency)—The Con-
gress of the Constitutional Democratic
Party, in a telegram to Admiral Kol-
chak, the head of the all-Russian gov-
ernment, urges all citizens of Russia
to unite around the Admiral in the
name of unity and independence of
Russia.
Admiral Kolchak, in reply, expressed
his thanks for the telegram and
said he would be glad to receive
"that at the decisive moment of the
struggle between our gallant Army
and the Bolshevik, when all the con-
stitutive forces of the country unite,
your party has chosen the
right path."
In conclusion the Admiral said:
"The future of Russia will be de-
cided by the freely chosen repre-
sentatives of the Russian people."

MARSHAL FOCH
MEETS ADVISERS
Paris, June 1—Marshal Foch and
his assistant, Major-General Way-
land, conferred Saturday with Louis
Loucheur, Minister of Reconstruction;
Major-General Sir Henry Wilson,
chief of the British staff, General
Dias, the Italian Commander-in-Chief,
General Tasker H. Bliss, on details
of the military occupation of the
Rhine region after the signing of
peace.

EMERGENCY MEETING
CALLED BY G.W.V.A.
DOMINION EXECUTIVE
Ottawa, June 1—An emergency
meeting of the Dominion executive of
the Great War Veterans Association
is called for June fifth to discuss the
present national situation. Announce-
ment to this effect was made to-
night by Dominion Secretary C. A.
MacNeil.
