

B., May 12.—The Bathurst Lumber Company makes the striking announcement that they have chartered a vessel to carry from 1800 to 2,000 tons of pulp from here to Philadelphia. The vessel, which is a sailing crat of the name of M. Vir-ien Pearce, will be here to load early next month. The significance of the announce-ment is to be found in the fact that this will be the first shipment of paip ever made from Bathurst by the water route, all the pulp production of this company being shipped to its destination by rail hitherto. 


