BOERS CHARGED RIGHT UP TO THE BRITISH LINES.

Louis Botha Led the Attack Upon Colonel Benson's Column.

FOUGHT DAY AND A NIGHT.

Boers Retired When Relief Under Colonel Barter Reached British, Whose Defence Had Been Most Stubborn and Successful—Colonel Benson Was Not the Canadian.

Pretoria, Nov. 2.—Commandant General Louis Botha is reported to have commanded the attack upon Col. Benson's column in person. Botha's force has effected a junction with another commando, which has been hovering around Bethel lately.

St. Catherine, Ont., Nov. 2.—(Special)—The Colonel Benson, mentioned in Lord Kitchener's despatches, having been killed near Halkington, Eastern Transvaal, is not Colonel Benson who formerly lived here, as was wrongly reported today.

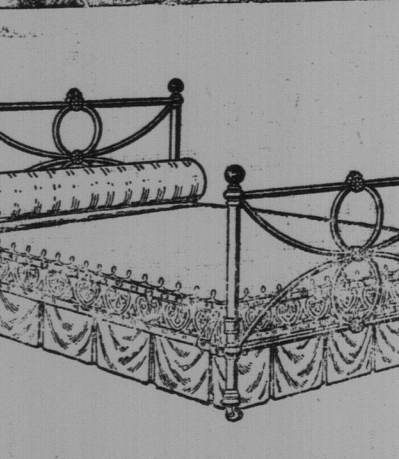

BERESFORD GREATHAD LARGEST SARDINE PACK.

Is in England and Claims to Have Won His Gable Trading Wager. Output of Maine This Year Estimated 1,500,000 Cases.

London, Nov. 4.—A man of about 40 has arrived at Southampton from Havre, who claims to have won a wager of £10,000 by walking around the world.

His name is Beresford Greathad, and he states that he was living at Winnipeg, Canada, when the idea of the trip was suggested to him. Two Vancouver elms disputed whether a man could walk around the world in five years, starting without money or luggage, and Mr. Greathad was selected to make the attempt.

He started in August, 1885, being given a free passage to Liverpool, and after tramping to John of Groats and thence to Lark's Head, he returned to London and was given a passage to Ostend. From Ostend he began a zigzag journey, which eventually brought him to Manchester. The war was in progress when he arrived, and he was taken prisoner. At the end of two months he escaped, but found it impossible to go on to Vladivostok, thence to Yokohama, and so back to Canada, as he had intended. Consequently he returned practically by the way he had gone.

He claims that practically he has won the wager, for the period by which the five years has been exceeded is accounted for by unavoidable detention, in which are included several imprisonments as a suspected spy.
